BOTSWANA

Ramogotsi Primary Girls have done it again; the girls were last week crowned this year's Under 13 Cricket League Champions. Ramogotsi Girls went into championship battle as the defending champions after scooping the title for the first time last year when the Under 13 girls' slot was first introduced.

The Under 13 league finals, held on the 14th of July 2010 at the Botswana Cricket Association (BCA) grounds, were between Ramogotsi Primary and rival Mojadife Primary school. Ramogotsi scooped the championship by scoring 91 runs for 2 wickets in 15 overs against Mojadife's 71 runs for 3 wickets in 15 overs.

Both schools have had an impressive record within the developmental cricket programme since its inception in 2007.

Mojadife boys have been champions of the Under 13 league for two consecutive years and the school has also won this year's Under 11 Boys league. After the match, there was a prize giving ceremony where awards were given for the most impressive players during the finals and during the duration of the tournament as a whole.

For the finals, Ramogotsi players were voted most impressive and took all the awards. The team, which was given an award for best spirit of the game, was Notwane Primary School while Itumeleng Phelaphela of Mojadife was named the emerging player of the tournament.

Meanwhile, the BCA recently sent off its Under 14 Boys' squad to the Eastern Junior Club Cricket Association (EJCCA) mini-cricket festival held in Benoni South-Africa. The festival is for Under 14 southern African teams.

GAMBIA

GCA held a Level 1 Umpiring Course from the 23rd - 25th June 2010 at the Gambia National Olympic House in Bakau. 14 participants attended the course. During the three day course the participants were introduced to the Laws of the game, qualities that makes a good umpire, umpires decisions and signals and other areas of umpiring.

At the end of the three day course, participants sat at an exam and the invigilator for the exam was Miss Sainabou kujabi a board member to the association. Most of the people that benefited from this course were veteran players and players who have played the game for five years. The Course instructor was Mr. Johnny Gomez the development officer for cricket in the Gambia.



On Tuesday June 29th a day Financial Management CAP course was run for administrators at the Gambia National Olympic House in Bakau. The course was sponsored by ICC/ACA and 18 administrators benefited from this course. Some of the areas under discussion were Budgeting, Bank Reconciliation, Balance Sheet, the role of a treasurer and other aspect of Financial Management were also dealt with in this one day program and the course instructor for this day program was J. KENYA

A two-day level 1 coaching course was held at Ruaraka Sports Club in Kenya from the 8-9 July 2010. 14 coaches from Nairobi province attended the course. Leader, Joseph Angara gathered mostly cricket coaches seeking to become part of the development programme in the near future and aspiring attendees looking to improve their knowledge on the game.

The course covered amongst other aspects of cricket, the role of the coach at various levels of the game, the equipment necessary to assist in the realization of these coaching tasks and some umpiring aspects that included the ways of dismissal and the importance of a coach to



understand the rules of the game and their interpretations that would directly impact on his players.

The candidates also learnt more about the key principles of running between the wickets, different aspects of bowling and batting as well as the fielding positions and drills.

The course content educated the participants on the definitions of the different terminologies of cricket, and the role of the coach was expounded to include demonstration of skills, cricketing knowledge and technique, enthusiasm, qualities of leadership and most important the technical ability.

Emphasis was also placed on the advantages of group coaching where a coach would involve several players to benefit from well-organized coaching sessions and conveniently use the services and abilities of individuals within the group to perform tasks demonstrations that could otherwise not be achieved individually. The teaching skills were covered in the sections of the course material and importance was placed on the coach giving information in bits and re-emphasizing the key points during practising and allowing the players more time to perform the skill as they look to master the techniques.



The Nairobi Province mini-cricket tournament was successfully held at Karura Forest Primary School on the 24th of July 2010 and saw 15 schools compete for the prestigious title of being declared Nairobi Champions. 14 of them were boy's teams and 12 of these were comprised of girl's squads.



The daylong event kicked off at 9am with schools contesting the group matches before getting to the elimination rounds later in the day. The competition was fierce amongst the top teams with the dominant sides showing intent from the onset.

Surprises were few as the event largely followed the script especially in the girl's competition where for the third time in a row Highridge Primary and Karura Forest contested the final.

The path to the final for Highridge Primary was rather straightforward as they swept aside all before them but Karura Forest needed a super-over to overcome a stubborn Murang'a Road Primary led by the competition's best batter Caroline Nduku. The scores were tied at 25 runs a piece after the conclusion of the allotted 5 overs and the super-over separated the two sides (7 to 5 in favor of Karura) and allowed the hosts to progress to the final.

It was third time lucky for Karura Forest Primary as they finally got the better of a determined Highridge Primary team, with a clinical bowling display that saw them restrict their opponents to a low total. The parklands team has always triumphed over the Forest side but fortune favored the hosts on an unpredictable surface with early dismissals of dependable Highridge batters and it was all over by the end of the first innings.

The win was achieved for the loss of two wickets and three balls to spare as the lasses celebrated their maiden win over their arch-rivals.

On the other hand, the boy's competition dazzled with little regard to the pecking order. Perennial under achievers Roysambu Primary upset the formbook to book a place in the final, having failed to get past the first round on all three previous occasions. They showed a lot nerves to beat hot favorites Karura Forest in the semifinals stage, after coming through via a play-off fought out by the so called groups of minnows (D&E). Interestingly, City Primary and Riverbank Primary served up a mouth watering clash as they went head to head in a repeat of last terms semi-final match where Riverbank achieved victory to make the finals, but lost cheaply to Karura Forest. For City the revenge was even sweeter as they went one better beating Riverbank and scooping the final against Roysambu.

MALI

From 15 to 19 July 2010, the Malian Cricket Federation organized the final of its 3rd edition of National Cricket championship which was held in Bamako capital city of Mali, on the lawn field of the National Institute of Youth and Sport.

Four teams were present in the final stage: two teams from Bamako (All Stars and Vampire Cricket Club), Regional Cricket team of Sikasso (Tata) and Regional team of Ségou (Reverend Père Bouvier). There were half a dozen members of FeMaCrik Executive Committee, Umpires, Scorers and match referees. The program consisted of 25 over matches in a round robin format. After this round robin format, the best two teams which were, Vampire Cricket Club (Bamako) and All Stars (Bamako) qualified for the final.

The match final opposed the two teams from Bamako, Vampire Cricket Club and the All Stars. It was played in 30 overs between the two top teams after the round robin. All Stars won The Vampire Cricket Club by the score of 128 for 10 wickets against 83 for 10 wickets. The trophy was



won by the All Star with an envelope of 100.000 Fcfa (the currency used in Mali), the equivalent of about U\$ 200. Half of this amount was given to the runners up

A very important number of official were present at the closing ceremony such as the Ambassador of Great Britain to Mali, the Ambassador of Burkina Faso to Mali, the Director of Aptech (Informatics training Centre), the Reps of Youth and Sport Ministry, the General Secretary of Students association and many other personalities. The event has been covered by ORTM (the National Television), The Africable (Panafrican channel), and many other local radios and newspapers.

The speech of the President began by a minute of silence on the memory of Vanpee Orgle the President of Ghana Cricket Association who passed away early this month. Let's also note that blacks arm bands have been used by players and match officials during all the competition to remember Vanpee Orgle.



MOROCCO

The Moroccan Royal Cricket Board, in its development plan, has started introducing cricket in schools. In April cricket has been introduced in 5 schools in Rabat, Sale, temara and now cricket has been taken to an other city named Marrakech. On 5 July 2010 cricket had been taught to about 300 kids in marrakech, and the players of the Australian team who were visiting Morocco from 29 June to 9 July 2010 assisted the Board in coaching the kids.



The Australian team had three matches with the national Moroccan team on 30th June in Rabat, on 5th July in Marrakech and on 8 July in Tanger; besides this event a press conference was held in Marrakech was held to explain the objectives of the board and to explain the game of cricket. All these events in Marrakech were arranged in collaboration with the local authorities of Municipality Lamnara and its President M. Adnan ben Abdellah in Marrakech with whom the Board signed a partnership agreement in order to get assistance to spread the game in different clubs in Marrakech and in schools.



In its objectives to introduce cricket in schools, the Moroccan Royal cricket Board has constructed 3 pitches with an amount of 15.616 dollars for the schools Ahmed Ennajai Temara Rabat, in order to afford practice for the kids; The pitches were inaugurated by the officials from the Schools, local authorities, Ministry of Education and members of the Board on 28 May 2010;



NAMIBIA

Cricket Coaching Clinic – Level 1

Johan Rudolph and his team of National players presented a level 1 coaching course at the end of June in Windhoek. Fifteen coaches from various schools and clubs attended the three day course which ended with a theoretical and practical examination. The participants did extremely well and are currently awaiting their certificates from ACA. Cricket Namibia will follow up on these coaches and continuously motivate, educate and evaluate them.

Scorers Clinic – Shortened Linear Version

During the final trials of the Namibia U/19 WCO squad 10 scorers were introduced to the shortened linear version of scoring by Dirk Reed. The theory of scoring was done an hour before the trial match started and the practical part was done during the match. Scoring education however requires regular training. Cricket Namibia will attempt to have at least two rookie scorers at each field during the U/19 Africa World Cup Qualifier in addition to the two qualified scorers. This should be sufficient training and experience for the scorers in preparation for the upcoming cricket season. The same exercise will be repeated at all planned youth tournaments in Namibia.

Regional Training Sessions



During the off season all the regions were visited by National players for coaching and talent identification. Cricket Namibia realize the incredible need for qualified coaches in each region to increase the exposure of decent coaching and matches to cricket players not experiencing the opportunities available in the capital city. Apart from Windhoek, the coast with the dedication and hard work of development officers Johnny Heynes and Justus Hangula, are performing the best with a lot of players coming through the

development program and representing Namibia on various age group levels. Three of our national players originally come from the northern region and this region still produces players of high quality. There is however a huge need for development in the southern region that needs to

be addressed. Cricket Namibia's biggest challenge has always been to overcome the distance stumbling block.

Girls Cricket Winter League

In the beginning of June the Private Schools of Namibia had a sport festival in Keetmanshoop. Cricket was one of the sport codes presented at the festival and four schools had a girls cricket team entered in the festival. Constant awareness needs to be made of the participation of girls in this sport code.

During June and July 55 girls between the ages of 13 and 19 participated in a Winter Girls Cricket League. The players of all the regions were selected in five different teams: Central Dragons, Northern Eagles, Red Devils, Western Vampires, Etosha. After 10 matches Central Dragons were crowned the winners with the Red Devils in a close second position. Preparations are being done for the Girls School League starting in September with a new sponsor for Ladies Cricket, Bank Windhoek on board.



U/19 Africa World Cup Qualifiers Squad



The National u/19 team has been selected after an intensive three months of training, trail matches and matches against the senior squad. The overall fitness levels are very good and with a month to go before the start of the WCQ, we believe the team will be up and ready to go. Wian van Vuuren and Steven Baard has played first class cricket the previous season and will have a great impact on the qualifiers. It's a well balanced team with good top and middle order batsman and a very good bowling attack. The team will play at least another 3 matches and all will attend a training camp from 23 to 27 August

NIGERIA

On July 6th 2010 the 2nd schools cricket development festival was hosted by Cricket Club Abuja at their ground at the National Stadium Complex, Abuja. The schools development festivals are an initiative by Cricket Club Abuja with the support of the Nigerian Cricket Association to introduce and sustain cricket in government secondary schools in the Federal Capital Territories and beyond. The first programme held in December 2009 saw 80 children from four FCT schools participate. The latest event attracted nearly twice the number of participants with 165 children from 10 schools in FCT.

Fifteen volunteer coaches (including five from Kaduna) gave up their time and under the guidance of NCF development manager Endurance Ofem, CCA programme manager Telema Daregoe and Schools Development Programme founder Richard Pembroke, they assisted the children through a range of activities. The schools that attended were:

- ⇒ Federal Government College, Kwali
- ⇒ Army Day Secondary School, Asokoro
- ⇒ Government Secondary School, Kwali
- ⇒ Federal Government Boys College, Apo
- ⇒ Government Secondary School, Nyanya
- ⇒ Federal Science & Technology College
- ⇒ Whiteplains British School, Jabi
- ⇒ Loyola Jesuit College, Gida Mongoro
- ⇒ Modern Secondary School, Maitama, Abuja
- ⇒ Government Secondary School, Tundun Wada, Wuse

The format of the festival followed the same format of the last programme where for the first half basic skills of cricket are introduced through a variety of fun games and activities. There is little or no technical coaching but instead the children get used to catching, fielding, throwing and holding and swinging a bat.



20 teams from the 10 schools (2 team per school) played in pool matches, quarter-finals and semi-finals until we had two teams through the Grand Final – Government Secondary School, Karo and Army Day Secondary School, Asokoro. After a thrilling match, played in front of all the rest of the children and coaches, Army Day Secondary School sneaked home defending their impressive 53 run total by just 8 runs. Player of the tournament was awarded to Daramola Seun of GSS, Karo who top scored in the final with 22 runs.

With flourishing interest and participation, the schools development programme will now extend to on-site visits to individual schools by a dedicated grassroots development coach funded by Cricket Club Abuja and the Schools Programme. The next festival has been scheduled for December 2010.

In preparation for the U-19 World Cup Regional Qualifier from July 25-30, 2010 in Swaziland, Nigeria's U-19 Cricket Team has, undergone physical fitness and mental conditioning exercises for strength, endurance and flexibility.

According to Okon Ukpong, Chairman of the Technical Committee of the Nigeria Cricket Federation, the technical team also organized a close camp for the players from July 5-14, 2010 in Lagos for more technical training. This involved sharpening and perfecting techniques in skills such as Batting, Bowling and Fielding.

According to the Coach of the Under-19 Team, Sean Philips, "the lads are in good spirit and the training programme was very much on course". The final phase of the preparation which entailed acclimatization and strategy fine tuning was held in South Africa from July 16-24, 2010 prior to the departure of the team to Swaziland.

SEYCHELLES (NEW AFFILILATE MEMBER AS OF JULY 2010)

SEYCHELLES' cricket has integrated the gentleman's game's international family and the sport can now go on with its plans to build an international standard field here after receiving a plot of land.



The local cricket family had come down in full force to the Maison Football on Friday night to celebrate the Seychelles Cricket Association (SCA) becoming the 105th member of the International Cricket Council (ICC), but National Sports Council (NSC) chief executive Alain Volcère's announcement that a plot of land has been demarcated on Ile Persévérance for the construction of a new field, was a cause for double celebration for the gathering.

"We believe that this is a significant asset which will hopefully provide a source of motivation towards the development of the sport," said Mr Volcère.

Among the many guests at the ceremony were Community Development, Youth and Sports minister Vincent Meriton, Youth and Sports principal secretary Denis Rose, Major Games director general Eric Arnephie and representatives of sponsors Mr Volcère made the announcement minutes after Eden Island chief executive Craig Heeger had called on the sports ministry to speed up the process of getting a plot of land for a new cricket field.

The NSC chief said he was happy to share the wonderful occasion in solidarity with cricketers, officials and well-wishers who all aspired to elevate the status of Seychelles cricket in a big way.

He added that the admission of the SCA into the ranks of the ICC is indeed an important milestone, a remarkable accomplishment which can only serve to boost the image of Seychelles cricket and at the same time, we should entice cricketing visitors and tournaments to Seychelles.

Mr. Volcère noted that SCA's new standings amongst the ICC members carries with it a combination of obligations and opportunities destined to help the prospects for the kind of development that would enhance the profile of the sport and give it its rightful place within the local sporting community.

"It is our hope that the SCA will seize the opportunity of its new position and the growing popularity of cricket worldwide to try to generate more interest and participation amongst all those longing to get involved in a sporting activity as players, volunteers or even sponsors," said Mr Volcère.

Local cricket head Jonathan Paul described SCA's application as an ICC member as "a long, arduous journey" before thanking the Seychelles government and all those who helped in the process.

He then read out two letters of congratulation received from new ICC president Sharad Pawar and Africa Cricket Association (ACA) chief executive Cassim Suliman, who also heads the development programme for Africa at the ICC-Africa Regional Office.

Former SCA chairman Ayub Suleman said he was proud that Mr Paul and his team have made his dream of making SCA an ICC member come true and thanked them for pushing up the number of cricketers and teams. Mr Suleman said that when he left as cricket head in 1995, there were five teams and 75 players, but now there are eight teams and 150 players. For his part, Eden Island chief executive Heeger said that it was important to celebrate the milestone in Seychelles cricket and added that his company will continue sponsoring cricket here.

SCA's application for ICC membership was approved by 104 members during the international body's annual conference at the Raffles City Convention Centre in Singapore from June 27 to July 1.

The local cricket family made the move to become an ICC member earlier this year and Mr Cassim visited Seychelles in January to do checks and balances as regards to SCA's application. Minister Meriton and Mr Volcère received mementos from Mr Paul and at the end of the formal ceremony, all present enjoyed themselves in a cocktail.



SWAZILAND

Swaziland Cricket Association hosted the Pepsi ICC–Africa U19 CWCQ Div2 Tournament in Big Bend from the 26-30 July 2010



Day One: Swaziland kicks off Africa U19 CWCQ in fine style

At Ubombo Country Club field, the hosts managed to beat Mozambique by three wickets. The combination of tight fielding and steady bowling saw the visitors bowled out for 53 all out in 24 overs.

In the other fixture of the day at U-Tech field, Nigeria thrashed Gambia by an impressive 10 wickets. Gambia elected to bat first and was bundled out for 112. The Nigerian batting went about the task very professionally and knocked the target off in 12 overs with ten wickets in hand. Rwanda defeated Mozambique by 87 runs to be named runners-up in the ICC Africa U19 Division 2 event on the final day played at Sisekelo High School in Big Bend, Swaziland on Friday. The
